168	ENG 201, 202 Shakespeare		Course description updated	The Shakespeare sequence (ENG201 and 202) provides an introduction to Shakespeare. It proceeds chronologically; ENG201 focuses on selected works from Shakespeare's early to middle career; ENG202 focuses on works from Shakespeare's middle to late career. Students will learn to interpret Shakespeare using a variety of critical strategies, including literary, historical, and psychological approaches. Topics include early modern ideas and attitudes about gender, sexuality, class, and identity; Shakespeare's representation of women and other marginalized groups; his influences and sources, both classical and early modern; historical and contemporary conventions of drama; and changing perceptions of Shakespeare through history. Courses may be taken out of sequence. Available to both first-year and sophomore students. 169	ENG 230 Environmental Literature		Course description updated	This course aims to explore the ways in which ideas about the physical or "natural" environment have been shaped into American literature. The course will survey a variety of important texts in this tradition and introduce students to different eras and genres of environmental literature and nature writing. Topics include Native American and Euro-American cultural perspectives, literary representations of nature, environmental ethics and history, progressive and radical writers, environmental legislation, and the impact of gender and race on environmental discourse. Recommended Prerequisites: WR095 with a grade of C or better, or appropriate placement test scores; AND RD090 with a grade of C or better or appropriate placement test scores. 4 lecture hrs/wk.
